From Sheet to Basket: Weaving Paper with Jiseung with Aimee Lee



One of the most miraculous yet utilitarian paper crafts to emerge from Korea is jiseung, a way of cording and weaving hanji, Korean Paper.

This historical technique was used to recycle paper by combining strips with basketry techniques.

Students will learn to cut a sheet of hanji into paired strips that they will cord and prepare for twining baskets.

They will also practice basic twining for two-or three-dimensional pieces and be introduced to traditional starch finishes.
